From Harri Luukkanen, Helsinki

2022 summer I prepared my vintage IC canoe for launch when my son Otso hoped to be skipper in his own boat. My decked International Canoe model is 90 years old, designed in 1932, when the international canoe union IRK ruled the races in Europe.

I stripper-built my decked two mast sailing canoe 'Venla' in 1993, sailed then some 20 years, until I parked it under a shelter, in garden of my summer cottage. When Marilyn visited Finland in 2004, she sailed with me in this boat. Now Venla sailed again, steered by Otso, 22y.

I had kept the masts, sails, rudder and ropes in my barn, and could find them all. The aluminium rudder needed some metal work, since a car had driven over it, but it was soon OK.

No sliding seat. At both sides is 15 cm wide deck where you can easily sit or hang, and while keeping your legs under the opposite deck, you will not drop in water in heavy wind turns.

I added 4 hutch on deck and bulk heads fore and aft, because I liked to keep camping gear dry when cruising in the archipelago and open Baltic Sea. The small opening, cocpit (70*100 cm), means that water is not running in, even if you get the masts in vertical position. On the other hand, Venla like Swe IIIB canoes, has an iron drop keel, and the 90 cm long and 20 kg heavy rostfree keel in my boat balance the the weight of carbon fibre masts, and it is difficult to capside my Venla.

The sailing canoes built in England, like the A type in the end of 1800s, had also iron drop keel. Thus it was much like Swe IIIB canoe, which was born later. Both types were heavier that those used in the USA, partly because the Americans build light river boats, while the Englishmen like sailors in Sweden and Finland sailed mostly on seaside in wind and waves.

My 1932 vintage Venla canoe, or the IRK IC boat, is much similar to the Swedish IIIB boat, except the sail area, which was 7.5 m2 (5.1+2.4), in Swe IIIB 10m2, with max beam of 110cm.

My Venla got some popularity, when a grp mould was made of it. Some 10 grp boat were made, and they were all sloop rigged (main sail 5.1m2 and fock 2.4m2, totally 7.5m2). Sloop rigged canoe, like the modern IC boat, is better in sailing against wind.

DEDICATION

OF THE

MEMORIAL TABLET AT SUGAR ISLAND

Three flags—those of the A. C. A., the U. S. A., and of Canada—unfurled at half mast on the headquarters green signalled the dawning of the day in which the American Canoe Association members assembled at Sugar Island were to devote a few hours to honoring their dead comrades who had given their all in the Great War. Between the three drooped banners and the landing dock of the island encampment, at the bend of the ramp leading from the dock to the green, there stood, as now stands, a rock. That rock, natural exemplar of the stalwart spirit and strength, in its geological mould was a mark of note at the A. C. A. encampment. But Headquarters Rock, as it had been named, gained an even greater glory when it was given to bear the bronze plaque that was set to honor our soldier dead.

To those of us who were there to see and to participate mere words are incapable of portraying accurately all which that lone rock signified, and with its new honor will continue to signify through the ages. It is with but vague perception of the unknown depths of emotion surrounding the deaths of brave men so simply listed that an attempt is here made to describe the memorable service which was held on the morning of August 12, 1922, at Sugar Island, in the heart of the Thousand Islands,—the unveiling of the Memorial Tablet to seventeen thoroughbred Americans, Yankee and Canadian brothers, who died

as heroes fighting for their flags and for humanity.

Headquarters Rock was peculiarly well placed for its new service as a memorial stone. Bearing its significant plaque in testimony of the spirit that was held by the chosen seventeen, the stone now bears a claim to fame, for the bronze plaque on the rock's side is reputed to be the first international tablet of its kind—one plate listing as one group citizens of the two political divisions of the world—that has been erected in tribute to those men who died in the war.

The unfurled flags at half mast bespoke to all at Sugar Island that bright August morning a deep and reverent silence. That silence was all the more forceful because it came at a time which for those who were to race that day—it was the big paddling day of the 1922 meet—it was not easy to give. Yet it was altogether fitting that this gala day should have been decreed as the day in which to honor those from among us who had paddled and sailed their last.

"Heroes these were, before They laid their paddles by

Heroes these were in sport;
Comrades they were—and friends—Boys of our common sort,
Boys of our self-same ends."

Thus did one A. C. A. brother, No. 7619, pay tribute in a poem, "Captains Unforgot" which was read at the memorial ceremony in dedication of the bronze tablet to:
